It will be wider at the bridge with a turn lane to accommodate the businesses, along with sub-surface drainage. Mayor Bourque stated in Phase I, we did the intersection at Main Street and Bernard Road to show the match. Karen stated that was a \$1 million dollar match. Joseph stated upon approval of the bid, the contractor will start mobilizing, which will probably take place at the end of the month. If we have no weather delays, project completion should be around Sept. 2024. Start date should be in the next 30-60 days. Councilwoman Girouard questioned if there is an alternate entrance for the LEDA Park businesses? 



EXHIBIT A

ARTICLE III. - OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC SAFETY AND HEALTH

Sec. 42-50 – Purpose.

The provisions of these sections are intended to supplement other provision of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Broussard relating to public nuisances and prohibited acts. The provisions herein are not intended to replace any other provision of the Code of Ordinances but shall constitute additional rules for dealing with public conduct.

Sec. 42-51 – Definitions.

- (a) Urination in public is the willful and intentional urination by a person in a public place, in a place not intended for such purposes or in a place open to the public view.
- (b) Defecation in public is the willful and intentional defecation by a person in a public place, in a place not intended for such purposes, or in a place open to the public view.

Sec. 42-52 - Prohibited Acts.

Urination in public and defecation in public are hereby prohibited and shall be considered misdemeanor crimes.

Sec. 42-53 - Penalty.

Whoever commits the crime of urination in public or defecation in public shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$500.00.
