Discussion: Daniel Hutchinson stated the original plan was for this project to come from Stine's going down Ambassador and crossing over to Bonin Road. That estimated cost was \$335,000. Daniel stated we changed the project instead to tie into Lafayette water near the Super One and coming back to service the businesses along Ambassador, which would be cheaper for us. Mayor Bourque stated we have a large development coming to the intersection of Bonin Road and Ambassador Caffery. Mayor Bourque stated he did get an e-mail today from the State stating the City has been awarded the \$500,000 for waterlines. The plan is to use some of this money for the waterline. Walter Comeaux stated we can possibly loop the water line in the future if the council approves. This will be brought back to the council to see if they want this done. Councilman Delahoussaye questioned it we plan on doing this, would the contractor honor these numbers? Walter stated they will have to consult with legal about this, because it may change the scope of the work. This resolution only allows us to accept the low bid.
