3. ORDINANCES FOR INTRODUCTION

3.1 Ordinance #21-712

An ordinance amending and re-enacting Section 18-258 of the Broussard Municipal Code establishing Flood and Drainage Standards Motion by Councilman Gary

Second by Councilman Higginbotham

Discussion: Walter explained this ordinance will clean up issues we ran into in the last couple of years. Nothing will change in the ordinance with the exception of the requirements. Walter stated there are a couple of things we are changing:

- 1) A house in a 100-year flood plain has to be built at base flood elevation. We have changed that when building it, it has to be built 12 inches above base flood elevation. We had another requirement that it had to be built 12 inches above the roadway or 12 inches above base flood elevation which ever is greater. We are cleaning up the wording. If the property owners come in to waive the 12 inches above the roadway because of extenuating circumstances, currently the council has to approve this. This will allow the City Engineer and the Public Works Directot to approve this as long as a hold harmless is signed. If they do not approve it, then the homeowner can still bring it to the council for approval. The Federal regulations; however, cannot be waived. Mayor Bourque stated in the older part of town we are running into areas that houses are having to be built 2 feet above the home adjacent to them.
- 2) Regarding development in a flood way, by Federal law nothing can be built in a flood way, however there are some exceptions. There are certain mechanisms for a homeowner or developer to build in a flood way thru FEMA. If it is done without following the guidelines every permit with the city will be frozen that the builder/developer has with the city.
- 3) Property owners are asking to close in their ditches. It can be done, but it needs to be done the right way. The new way we would do analysis and charge the customer. It would be \$500 for a residential analysis Regardless, if the request is approved or not it will still cost \$500 and it is non-refundable. Our engineer will do the analysis and decide what is necessary. The process we have right now is not working. This would cut out the 3rd party engineers. It will be clean, and it will work better. Mayor Bourque stated we are not encouraging anyone to close in ditches; we only want to continue doing it the right way should anyone ask to do it. We can do it and if it does not work, we can come up with something else. Walter stated there are certain circumstances everyone once in a while when someone has a steep ditch, and it is a safety issue. Mayor Bourque stated we definitely will not cross any boundaries on what FEMA requires from the city. Walter stated

we are ahead of other communities when it comes to drainage. We have the same standards as Lafayette, but we allow them to do things other do not allow; but we do have a certain criteria to meet.
