### 3. OTHER BUSINESS

Christopher Ventre and Stuart Breaux/Hammerhead Capital 3.1 Preliminary Subdivision Plat Approval for 200-home neighborhood on Moulin Road subject to the condition that the entire development shall be continuously owned by a single owner and that no lot or lot(s) comprising less than the entirety of the development shall be sold without approval by the city. Discussion: Mr. Ventro addressed the council. He feels this project will be an asset to the Parish and the City. In August they had a met with the City Officials. On Nov 9th, they submitted their project to the planning commission for review and approval. On Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>, they received the report and comments from the review at the Planning Commission meeting. On Dec. 9th the plat was conditionally approved subject to the plat approval which had to be brought back to the council. This will be a 240-unit Single Family Gated Subdivision. Everything will be maintained by the development. Mr. Ventre stated a draft agreement has been drawn up for approval by the city and them. Ventre continued to explain that there will be a club house, pools, a park, and playgrounds in the development. The streets will be private with a 40 foot right of way. They are asking for a variance to the front setback from 20 feet to 10 feet. The homes will not have any garages. On the plat there is an 11-front set-back. Councilman Bonin questioned, so there won't be any garages? Mr. Ventre stated no, each home will have accommodations for 2 cars stacked. Mel Bertrand questioned where the homes will be in reference to the utility easement, because with the utility easement is in front and his concern is the homes are close to the easement. He feels the homes may face foundation issues in the future. Mr. Ventre stated the homes will be built like an apartment complex. Mayor Bourque stated the roads in the development will stay private,

Mayor Bourque stated in the past we have done hold harmless agreements. Mel questioned what he will do with the trees in easement; the city will not be responsible for maintaining these trees. Walter stated the concern is that this is

harmless being done.

but he is unsure about the water. Mel questioned if each home would have their own meter or will there be a master meter at the entrance. Water and sewer have to be 6 feet apartment in the utility easement and in some places the sewer will have to be deeper. Mel stated he would like to see a hold harmless done for the city not to be responsible for any foundation problems in the future. Councilman Delahoussaye questioned Mel, what one be better one main line going into each house or a master meter? Mel stated it would be better for the water and sewer to be private. Gerald stated they can take care of that with the agreement. Mr. Ventre stated as a rental property it would be best if they each have their own meter. This would be more responsible. He has no problem with the hold

rental subdivision and in a couple of years the lots may be sold, but they will have to come back to the council for that approval. Gerald stated he will get with their attorney to put the agreement together with all the stipulations. Mayor Bourque stated they were asked to come back to the council for final approval. In the agreement, the buffer zones will not be challenged, their will be a single owner clause and it will be single family residential. We will also need to put language in there for a hold harmless. Walter stated a traffic study will also have to be done on their part. Mr. Ventre stated that is standard practice. Councilman Bonin stated so there are 2 variance requests for the front and side set-back. Councilwoman Racca stated she is not quite sure how one side of the house has a zero-lot line. Mr. Ventre stated it would be 0 on one side and then 12 on the other side for each house. You would have more, on one side. Councilman Bonin asked where else have they built? Mr. Ventre stated they are currently building off Ridge Road. Chief Champagne stated he has concerns about the utilities not being public. In the past they have dealt with private utilities that the hydrants were not being maintained for years which caused a lot of problems. There will also be a problem with people parking in the street and how does a fire truck get thru. This is something they deal with on a regular basis. Mr. Ventre stated the roads are full size roads. Councilman Delahoussaye questioned how many bedrooms do the homes have? Mr. Ventre stated 2, 3 and 4 bedrooms. Councilwoman Girouard questioned if all the homes will have the same amount of parking? Mr. Ventre stated yes. Councilman Bonin stated he wants a traffic study done. Mr. Ventre stated they will put the traffic study in the agreement along with the hold harmless for the utilities. Councilman Bonin stated he wants it on the record, that if the roads need to be re-surfaced, they will do it. Mr. Ventre stated with the 3- and 4bedroom units they can lengthen the driveway. Gerald stated they will tie all of this into the ordinance that is currently be prepared for the operators of rental property. We do not have that ordinance yet, but we will see what sort of regulations are needed for the ordinance to hold up. Gerald stated the variances were addressed tonight will be in the agreement along with the stipulations given. The permit will not be issued until everything is done.
