# 3.1 Walter Campbell

Candidate for Lafayette Parish Assessor

Mr. Campbell addressed the council. He graduated from UL in 1991. He has 2 children, a wife, and grandchildren. In 2008 he went to see Louis Perret, Clerk of Court and told him he was interested in the position of Parish Assessor. Mr. Perret informed him the current person in that position is doing a good job. So now, the current assessor is retiring after 24 years, and he is still interested in the position. He feels he can bring a lot of changes to the office such as 1) technology, 2) updates for tax freeze assessed values, 3) consolidation of services and 4) homestead exemption fraud. He is also endorsed by the republican party. This is not a stepping-stone for him; he will be committed to this position as long as the voters want him. He thanked the council for their time.

# 3.2 The Pines Apartments

Condemnation Update

Ben stated he spoke to Mr. Le, the owner of the property today. He does have a contract to sell the property by July 25<sup>th</sup>. Since the building has been condemned it is still boarded up and he is complying with the requirements. Mayor Bourque requested Ben report back to the council by the closing date. Ben stated that Mr. Le does have a second buyer if the first sale does not go through.

#### 3.3 The Villas @ Albertsons

Agreement Review

Walter stated this will be built as a townhouse development with individual lot units. We are using the same agreement as we did for the Moulin Road development. They want to start building, but a Certificate of Occupancy will not be issued until the entire development is complete. The developer will contribute money for the construction of a sewer lift station which will remain under private ownership and will donate a location acceptable to the City along Albertsons Parkway for installation of the lift station. The City shall own and operate the water and sewer lift station, which shall remain under private ownership. The city will only take ownership of the lift station and not the lines. The developer will pay for a traffic study and will be responsible for road improvements that are needed, including the extra lane. Oscar stated he feels everything has been covered in the Agreement between the City and the Developer. Deputy Chief Justin Denais questioned if we are putting fire hydrants in the development? Mayor Bourque stated yes, we are.
